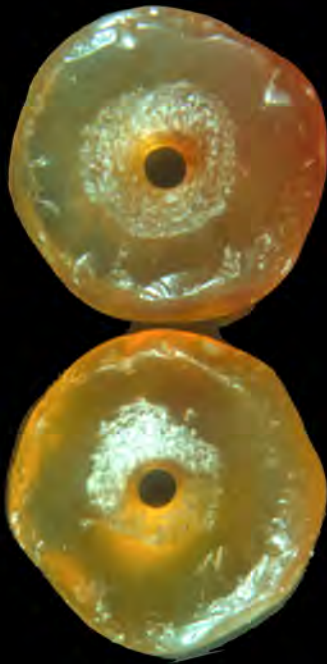




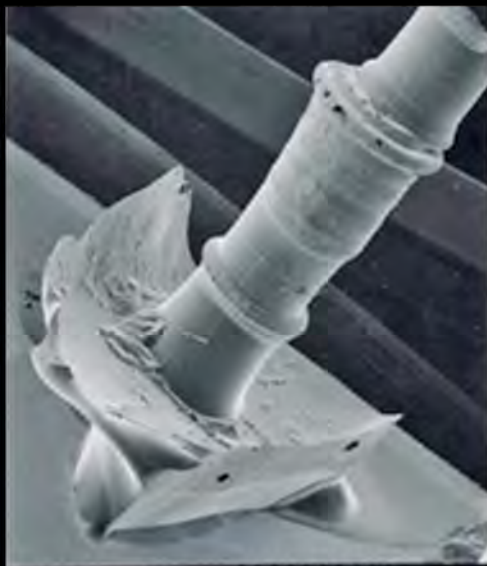
Archaeological Science Centre Lecture Series Presents

Jonathan Mark Kenoyer, Professor in Anthropology, teaches archaeology and ancient technology at the University of Wisconsin, Madison. He has taught at Madison since 1985. His main focus is on the origins of technology and urbanism in South Asia with a special focus on the Indus Tradition. He has worked on excavations and ethnoarchaeological studies in both Pakistan and India since 1974. He has a special interest in ancient technologies and crafts, socio-economic and political organization as well as religion. These interests have led him to study a broad range of cultural periods in South Asia as well as other regions of the world, including China, Japan, Korea, Oman, and West Asia in general.
